My journey with the Comptroller's office started when I applied for an Enterprise Security Analyst internship. I was in my final year at the University of Texas at San Antonio as a cybersecurity major, and I knew that a summer internship in my field would help me land a job when I graduated.

I arrived at the LBJ building on the first day not quite knowing what to expect (and feeling more than a bit nervous). I had plenty of preconceived notions about working for the government — I imagined that the Comptroller's office would be made up entirely of ancient civil servants using outdated technology. I was assigned a project to implement a new phishing
response tool. My team helped guide me through the
implementation process, giving me valuable experience
in the planning and change management procedures
used in enterprise environments. Besides the standard
internship duties, my manager encouraged me to take
advantage of any extra learning opportunities and
to direct the internship to areas I was interested in

learning more about.
As a result, I was able to expand my skills using PowerShell, create tools and scripts to manage user accounts, learn more about incident response/vulnerability management and more.
